One State Board meeting completed! Whew! Yes, it was a good meeting with 16 attending. We met right on time at 12:00 noon and were done by 4:00. The weather was good but it should be in September. Our Spring Board meeting was set for Saturday, April 25, 2020 at the same time

We also discussed the Biennual NDFMC Convention for 2021 to be held in Fargo and set a tentative date for April 22 - 24 in 2021. Evelyn Sampson Award Winner Calum Sommer

The Evelyn Sampson award of \$600 is given to the student of a NDFMC teacher who is attending the Junior Composers Institute at the U of MN. Students can only receive the Sampson award one time, therefore last year's winner, Liza Miller, was ineligible to receive it although she attended JCI again this year. No other students of NDFMC teachers applied. Therefore, the student of an North Central Region teacher was eligible to apply for the award.

Calum Sommer, 13, presently lives in Bettendorf, Iowa; however, since his dad is in the military, Calum has moved many times in his life. His first piano teacher was his mother who instructed him from age 5 to 10.

Calum has composed a number of pieces. His Rondo received 2nd place in the lowa Junior Composers Contest, Level III. He has participated in festival as well, and accompanies his siblings in recitals, and plays piano in the school jazz band. He also plays French horn and is beginning to play mellophone in the marching band.

Reports from Kris Brugamyer NDFMC State Treasurer

IMC Scholarships are available from the NDFMC

For the third year in a row, the NDFMC is offering up to \$2000 in supplemental scholarships to NDFMC junior members registering to attend the International Music Camp (IMC) in the summer. These scholarships will cover up to 75% of the IMC's Early Bird registration fee and are available to any music student who is either: 1) a member of a Junior Club that belongs to a music instructor who is a senior member of the NDFMC; or 2) an individual junior member (not part of a Junior Club) who studies under a music instructor who is a senior member of the NDFMC. (Annual membership dues for individual junior membership is \$13 and includes a subscription to *Junior Keynotes* for the student.)

There is good news for students who will be receiving a partial camp scholarship from another source. If they meet the requirements listed above, they may still apply for the NDFMC's supplemental scholarship. In such cases, the

NDFMC's scholarship will be added to the other scholarship aid the student is receiving, but in no case will the total amount of aid exceed 75% of the IMC's Early Bird registration fee. The IMC, not the NDFMC, will make the final determination of the amount awarded to each eligible student who applies. The decision will be made shortly after the application's deadline of May 8, 2020.

The 2020 application form will be available to access on the IMC's website in the future. Until it is posted on the IMC's web site, you can still view the 2019 application form. Go to http://internationalmusiccamp.com and click on "Registration Info." From there, click on "Scholarships" in the red side banner. Look for "2019 NDFMC Scholarship" in the list.

Umbrella Policy to Change to Mentorship Policy in 2020-2021

• The Current Umbrella Policy

For many years the NDFMC has had a policy known as the Umbrella Policy. It was meant to help out NDFMC teachers who had only a few students, by allowing those students to have junior membership through another teacher's junior club, usually for the purpose of being eligible to participate in one of the festivals held in North Dakota.

Each year, a few teachers umbrella more students than are in many of our junior clubs. This is not fair to the teachers who continue to renew their junior clubs with as few as 2 or 3 students in them.

To remedy this, an ad hoc committee was appointed last spring to review the NDFMC's umbrella policy and to bring a report and recommendation back to the board in the fall. The committee brought a motion to the state board in September, seeking to turn the umbrella policy into a mentoring policy. After discussion and a little amending to the original motion, the new policy was unanimously approved by the NDFMC board.

• The New Mentorship Policy

Beginning next year (during the 2020-2021 membership season), the umbrella policy will be replaced with the new mentorship policy. The mentorship policy will be available ONLY to teachers who are NEW to the festival program. Under this policy, they will be able to add their students to the junior club of an experienced teacher (the mentor), and in return, the mentor will guide the new teacher through the process of preparing and entering their students in the festival. There will be no limit as to how many students each new teacher may add to their mentor's junior club in a year, but there will be a limit of two years for using the mentorship policy. This means that after two years, the teacher being mentored will need to either: 1) form a junior club of their own; or 2) have their students become individual junior members of the NDFMC.

The cost to be mentored will be \$14.00/year, payable to the NDFMC. This amount will include payment for a year's

subscription to *Junior Keynotes* for the teacher being mentored. As was true with the umbrella policy, the teacher being mentored will also be responsible to pay any additional junior dues required if the total junior club membership of their mentor's junior club exceeds 16 students after adding in their students.

Two Options for Teachers who will not qualify to be Mentored

Beginning next membership season, teachers who have umbrella-ed in the past will no longer qualify to do so, because the umbrella policy will be replaced by the new mentorship policy, and it will apply only to teachers *new* to the festival program. Therefore, to keep students' junior membership active, teachers who do not qualify to be mentored will need to choose one of two junior membership options for their students: 1) form a junior club; or 2) have the students become individual junior members of the NDFMC.

Rates for Individual Junior Membership Dues and for Junior Club Dues

Currently, junior club dues are \$30.00 and will cover up to 16 students in the junior club. Individual junior membership dues are \$13.00/student and include a year's subscription to *Junior Keynotes* for the student. Individual junior membership may be a more desirable option, if a teacher has only one or two students. Both types of junior dues are payable to the NDFMC and are to be sent to the state treasurer in the fall.

This year there are major changes to the way the NFMC Junior Composers Contest is being administered. This is all part of a general centralization of

festivals and should make the complex jobs of this very large organization, run mainly by volunteers, easier to run. But I want you to know that I am still here for you, to help you

through the process, either answer your questions or find answers to your questions. (It's new to me also.)

There are links to forms on the NFMC site. The completed registration forms, your pdf compositions and mp3 recordings will all be sent to national headquarters, and payment information will be on the form. Instructions are on the forms which you can download from the NFMC site. Once all of the required materials and the registration money have been received, NFMC will notify me, then I will download it onto my computer. Try to "beat the deadline." I have been told that all state deadlines and fees will be on the national form, but in case they aren't **the state deadline is February 1**st.

Class I – 9 years and under	\$15 (\$10 State Fee + \$5 National Fee)
Class II - 10-12 years old	\$17.00 (\$12 State fee +\$5 National Fee)
Class III - 13-15 years old	\$20.00 (\$15 State fee+ \$5 National Fee)
Class IV - 16-18 years old	\$20.00 (\$15 State fee+\$5 National Fee)

All State & National fees are to be paid to the NFMC directly

Everything then will proceed as usual: I will send the information to the judges and return the completed ratings sheets to you when sent to me by the judge. All composers will receive the judge's comments and a score of points ranging from 50-100. In addition, the judge will select two "winning" compositions from each age class to advance to Regional judging. The Class 3 and 4 State Winners will be first to be offered scholarships to attend Junior Composers Summer Programs in July, but everyone who has sent in a composition will qualify. Compositions at the regional level will receive a rating but no comments: highest rating will advance to the national level. Some cash prizes are offered at these two levels. Regional and national winners will be asked to submit social security numbers. You will be contacted if this is needed.

At each level, I will have the immense pleasure of being able to communicate the good news to everyone.

Please note that all news is good news even though some news will make you happier than others. You all do a tremendous job by just participating. But we are not musical geniuses like Mozart and have to "learn" our way to the top. On the way teachers and judges sometimes have to make difficult choices between very good students. So-compose; compose for the enjoyment of composing; keep smiling; keep trying; don't give up.

Teachers who are encouraging students to take the musical risks required in composing, we thank you. You are giving your students a magical gift. I look forward to hearing the results of your efforts.

MORE CLUB NEWS
